

Micro Spike Buttons Rondelle Ring

- 2) Taking care that the beadwork isn't twisted, pass the right needle through the cylinder bead added in Stitch 1; pass the left needle back through the same cylinder bead (Fig. 4) Repeat the thread path of the entire spacer to reinforce. Secure the thread and trim
- 3) Sew rondelles together passing up through the cylinder beads of the large rondelle into the cylinder beads of the smaller rondelle. Sew a spike to the center of the small rondelle. Secure thread ends. Sew the stacked rondelles to the peyote band




Fig. 3: Adding Stitch 3




Fig. 4: Stitching the base into a ring

MATERIALS & TOOLS

10 Crystaletts Micro Spikes 5 Stud Buttons 15-10° Japanese cylinder beads 11° Deicas to make ring band 6 or 8 lb FireLine Scissors

2 size 11 beading needles

ARTIST'S TIPS

Knot the thread to both needles to keep the thread from pulling out. The opening on the beads and the buttons are large and the knots will pass through easily
